
This graph illustrates the river flows during a flood event. The example is the June 6th 14.6 event. The graph shows the highest water at Surrey happens when the peak flow North happens. These peak flows dump into **Cypress Island Swamp** in St Martin Parish which is our natural floodplain.


Gage height, feet

REMOVAL OF SPOIL BANKS ALONG RIVER AND RUTH CANAL

STATE OF LOUISIANA

(LIDOR SURVEY 2004)

This is where the river flows
North to during a flood event.
Flood water enters Cypress Island
Swamp in St Martin Parish near
the airport. Our #1 project is to
level these spoil banks to allow
quicker dispersion into this
natural floodplain area holding
down the crest to less than 14'
which will harm no one.
